Resident Pets

Most of you have provided updated vaccination records for your pets. Your cooperation is appreciated. Effective 1 July 2024, the monthly pet fee will increase to \$32.00 per month. This adjustment is in line with the overall 5% increase applied to the monthly service fees and is necessary to cover the increased costs of maintaining a pet-friendly campus, including upkeep of common areas and pet amenities.

Village Store Meal Plan Items

We understand there has been some confusion about which items can be purchased with your Meal Plan at the Village Store. We have confirmed that the following items are available for purchase using your Meal Plan:

Milk, Soda Drinks, Water, Sandwiches, Chef Salad, Fruit, Wine and Beer

Sara Alert Notification System

Our Sara Alert program can send email, text, and voice message notifications when Resident Services needs to convey important information promptly. If you are not receiving these notifications, or if you prefer not to receive any of them, please contact Resident Services.

New Package Delivery Procedure

To improve the handling of resident packages left at the Front Desk, we have implemented a new form and procedure. When a package arrives, the form will include:

- The resident's name and apartment number
- The carrier
- The date and time the package was received
- The method used to notify the resident (such as phone call or voicemail) along with the date and time of notification

The resident will sign the form when picking up the package, noting the date and time. The Front Desk staff will initial the form to confirm each step's completion, and the form will be filed in a Package Delivery Binder. This new procedure is designed to reduce the likelihood of packages being lost, delivered to the wrong apartment, or kept at the front desk for too long.

It is no secret that Artificial Intelligence or also known as AI is starting to take over the technology world.

example, reasoning, making decisions or solving problems. So, how does this involve Scamming? Well, the most obvious example of how scammers use this new AI technology is by:

- Write more convincing and natural-sounding phishing emails and text messages.
- Create deepfakes of celebrities to trick victims into thinking they're investing in a good company or project.
- Impersonate the victim's friend or relative and ask for money as part of a <u>grandparent scam</u>.
- Impersonate an employer and ask for personal information.

The potential to create an image, video, or voice of someone else could make existing scams even more believable and this opens new opportunities for scammers.

Bill Wilt, Volunteer

Bill Wilt, an eight-year resident of BSTE, received the 2023 Joint Base San Antonio Certificate of Volunteer Excellence, at the annual JBSA Volunteer Awards Ceremony held at Fort Sam Houston on 17 April 2024. For the past seven years Bill has volunteered as the docent for the USAF Airman Heritage Museum, located at Lackland AFB. His main focus has been on the Curtis JN-4D, known as the "Jenny", a WWI bi-plane. The museum owns an actual Jenny which is on display inside the building. Every Thursday afternoon following BMT graduation, hundreds of parents, friends and graduates, would listen to his overview of the Jenny's history. If the visitors showed interest, his insight could continue for 5 to 30 minutes or more. There would be many questions from the



audience about the plane, the Air Force in general and Bill's career in particular. Bill introduced Lt. Col Travis Smith, USAF (Ret) to the museum. Lt Col Smith was a BSTE resident. He was a P51 Mustang fighter pilot during WWII, with 64 combat missions. Bill said "It was sometimes hard to tell who was having more fun, the airmen, their parents or Trav!" Trav's last appearance at the Museum was on his 100th birthday, March 23, 2023. Bill's efforts to bring Travis into the museum community brought the airmen into a part of USAF history and a sparkle into Travis' eye!

Freedom House Dementia Caregivers Support Group



Book Club ~ Nancy Sowada

On June 3, the Blue Skies East Book Club enjoyed the discussion of The Heaven and Earth Grocery Store by James McBride. Our next book is Demon Copperhead by Barbara Kingsolver. We will discuss that book on **July 15** at 10am in the CC rooms. Demon Copperhead was a co-recipient of the 2023 Pulitzer Prize for

Fiction, and won the 2023 Women's Prize for Fiction. Kingsolver was inspired by the Charles Dickens novel David Copperfield. While Kingsolver's novel is similarly about a boy who experiences poverty, Demon Copperhead is set in Appalachia and explores contemporary issues. The main character, Damon Fields, is born to a teenage mother in a trailer home. He is raised in Lee County, located in Appalachian Mountains



of Virginia, and nicknamed "Demon Copperhead" for the color of his hair and his attitude. As Demon grows up, he must use his charms and wits to survive poverty in the contemporary American South. A copy of this book is in the Blue Skies East library. On July 15, we will also select books to read for November and December and the first part of 2025. Please join us!

Village Voices ~ Nancy Sowada

In 1975, Blue Skies East residents George Howard and Jim Leddon joined forces to formalize The Village Voices. Beryl McKesson was the accompanist. "The first meeting of the Village Voices was held in 1976 with one objective in mind-the love of singing" (Col. Howard). In 1987, residents from Air Force Village II joined. In 1995, George Howard died, and John Lile became the conductor and accompanist. Programs by the Village Voices have been presented at many places, including USAA with the USAF Band of the West; OTS Choir at Medina Base, nursing homes in the city, as well as The Mission, Vista, Freedom House and Liberty House; Main Chapel at Lackland; Lions and Rotary Clubs; Army Retirement Center; USAA Towers; churches; 1982 Dedication of glass window at Air Force Village I; Fort Sam Houston and Lackland Officers' Clubs; Howard Hall at Lackland AFB dedication program; and others. In 2016, ill health caused John Lile to retire from directing the Village Voices and Rob Jenkins took over direction and accompanying. In 2018, resident Nancy Jones Sowada took over direction of the Village Voices.

The Village Voices practice from 1:30-3:30 every Tuesday from August through May in the chapel at Blue Skies West. The Village Voices have a spring and fall performance show for Blue Skies East and West and they also perform each spring and fall at the Mission, the Vista, and Freedom House. In addition, they perform for the Veterans Day and Memorial Day programs at Blue Skies West. They are available to perform at other times, when requested. The members of the Village Voices are excited to be in our 49th year of continuous existence. We thank

residents for your continued support through the Air Force Village Charitable Fund and the Blue Skies West Activities Coordinating Council. Join us for rehearsals beginning August 20. The picture (*right*) is from one of our spring 2024 performances.
